### Falcons lose to Johnson C. Smith 19-13

The Falcon football team lost a close game to the Johnson C. Smith Golden Bulls Saturday. The Golden Bulls nabbed a 19-13 win over Saint Augustine's College Saturday (Oct. 11) at Irwin Belk Complex in Charlotte. The Falcons (2-5 overall, 1-3 CIAA) led the game until the Golden Bulls' fourth-quarter surge, during which they scored 16 points.

### CIAA honors Smith, Mortimer for second straight week

For the second consecutive time, freshman setter Roxanne Smith (St. Catherine, Jamaica) of Saint Augustine's College was named CIAA volleyball Rookie of the Week, and Head Coach Covance Mortimer was chosen as CIAA volleyball Coach of the Week.
