Saint Augustine's College "Falcons" vs. Catawba "Indians"

THE KICKOFF

Saturday, August 29, 2009 – Kickoff at 1:30 p.m.

THE SITE

Broughton High School Stadium (3,800 capacity / natural grass) - Raleigh, N.C.

2009 RECORDS

This is the season opener for both teams.

THE EVENT

Saint Augustine's College hosts Catawba College in the season opener for both teams, which meet for the second time in two years. The non-conference contest is designated as Faculty/Staff Day. The Falcons are looking for their second straight win over the Indians. The Falcons play four of their first five games at home.

THE SERIES

This is the second meeting between both teams. The Falcons lead the series 1-0 after defeating the Indians 14-7 in 2008. The Falcons are the first CIAA team to beat the Indians, and they also snapped the Indians' 13-game win streak in home openers.

THE LAST MEETING

(Saint Augustine's College 14, Catawba 7 - Aug. 30, 2008 - Salisbury, N.C.) -

The Falcons stunned the Indians, who were ranked 14th nationally by D2football.com in the preseason. The Falcons took advantage of two Indian turnovers to pull off the upset. The Falcons not only became the first CIAA team to beat the Indians, but they snapped the hosts' 13-game win streak in season openers. Quarterback Anthony Brown scored the game-winning touchdown on a 12-yard scamper with 13:24 left in the fourth quarter. Adison Daniels kicked the extra point. The score occurred one play after the Falcons recovered a muff on a punt. The Falcons preserved the win by stopping the Indians in Falcon territory twice in the fourth quarter. On the first drive, Marcus Kennedy recovered a fumble at the Falcon 39-yard line one play after a long Indian kickoff return. On their final drive, the Indians marched from their own 6-yard line to inside the Falcon 20-yard line late in the game. The Falcons held on downs, and then ran out the clock for the victory. The Falcons led 7-0 in the second quarter when Lendell Bembo leaped to catch a 35-yard pass from Brown over the Catawba defense in the back of the end zone for a touchdown. Adison Daniels booted the extra point. Linebacker Stephan Stanback intercepted a pass in Indian territory to set up the first Falcon touchdown. The Indians tied the game 7-7 on the last play before halftime. Brandon Bunn hauled in a 29-yard pass from Howard Williamson, and Thomas Trexler kicked the PAT. Walter Sanders led the Falcons with 72 rushing yards and 25 receiving yards. He helped the Falcons gain 159 yards on the ground. Brown completed 7 of 13 passes for 88 yards and also rushed for 40 yards. Steven Stanback led the Falcons with 11 total tackles, and Kennedy added 9 total tackles including 3.5 tackles for loss, one fumble recovery and one sack. Jamel Moore contributed 8 tackles for the Falcons. The Indians scored 28 or more points each game in 2007 as they reached the NCAA Division II playoffs, but they were held to 235 total yards and seven points in the loss to the Falcons in 2008.

THE HEAD COACHES

Michael Costa enters his eighth season at Saint Augustine's College as one of the most respected head coaches in the CIAA. The 2003 and 2005 CIAA football coach of the year, Costa is an energetic leader who instills discipline and intensity in his players. Costa is the Falcons' only head coach since the school revived football in 2002. During his tenure at Saint Augustine's College, Costa has produced three All-Americans (Kevin Jones, Alex Hall, Marcus Kennedy) and 21 All-CIAA players including eight first-team selections. Several former players have gone on to professional careers, including former standout Alex Hall, who currently plays for the NFL's Cleveland Browns. Some have embarked on coaching careers such as 2005 CIAA defensive player of the year Tyrone Pettaway, who is an assistant on the University of Tennessee staff. The Falcons have achieved several noteworthy accomplishments during Costa's reign. In 2005, the Falcons were the first CIAA team to earn a No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II Southeast Region. That same year, the Falcons tied a school record with eight wins. From 2005 to 2007, the defense was ranked in the top 10 nationally in total defense. In 2008, the Falcons ranked 13th nationally in total defense. His Falcon teams own a 3-2 record over crosstown rival Shaw, the two-time defending CIAA champion. The Falcons also gained national attention with wins over nationally-ranked Catawba 14-7 in 2008 and Mars Hill 13-6 in 2005. Both teams play in the highly-regarded South Atlantic Conference. Costa developed a reputation as a tireless worker at Wilmington (Del.) High School where he was an assistant football and basketball coach. His first head coaching job was at Cheyney University of Pennsylvania. He coached at Cheyney for five seasons from 1985 to 1990. After Cheyney, Costa coached at Virginia Union University, Hampton University, Elizabeth City State University and Miami (Fla.) Central High School in various assistant roles before coming to Saint Augustine's College. Costa received a bachelor of science degree in Health and Physical Education from Norfolk State University. He graduated with a master's of education degree in Health and Physical Education from West Chester State University of Pennsylvania. Costa also holds a master's of education degree in Educational Administration from Cheyney University of Pennsylvania. Costa and his wife, Cassondra, are the proud parents of two children, Michael III and Alyse Nicole.

Chip Hester enters his eighth season at Catawba College, where his record in seven years is 53-24. In 2007, he led the Indians to an 11-2 record and a berth to the NCAA Division II playoffs, where they advanced to the second round. For his efforts, Hester was named AFCA Region coach of the year. The 11 wins equaled a school record. It was the second time the Indians won the South Atlantic Conference (SAC) championship and the third time they reached the playoffs under Hester. A 1992 graduate of Guilford College, Hester earned a bachelor's degree in business management. He completed a master's degree in sports management at Georgia Southern in 1993. While completing his master's degree, Hester worked as an intern at Catawba, assisting football, sports information and athletic operations. He graduated from Millbrook High School in Raleigh in 1988.

STEVENSON NAMED D2FOOTBALL.COM PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Defensive tackle Phillip Stevenson (Jr./Statesville, N.C.) of Saint Augustine's College was named to the 2009 Preseason D2football.com Division II All-America second team on Aug. 18. Stevenson is the second Falcon player in school history to make the D2football.com preseason All-America team. Former Falcon defensive end Alex Hall, who currently plays for the Cleveland Browns, was a two-time selection on the squad in 2006-07.

D2FOOTBALL.COM HONORS STEVENSON, CRUMP

Defensive tackle Phillip Stevenson (Jr./Statesville, N.C.) of Saint Augustine's College was named 2009 Preseason CIAA Defensive Player of the Year by D2football.com on Aug. 17. Stevenson joins teammate Marcus Crump (Redshirt Sr./Pittsboro, N.C.) on the 2009 Preseason All-CIAA team chosen by D2football.com, which is a website devoted to covering NCAA Division II football. Stevenson, a 6-foot-3, 270-pound junior defensive tackle, led the CIAA and tied for eighth nationally with 10 sacks last season.

Both Stevenson and Crump, a 6-foot-6, 240-pound redshirt senior defensive end, combined for 17 of the Falcons' 33 sacks a year ago. Both players helped the Falcons rank 13th in Division II total defense last season.

FALCONS EARN HIGH PRESEASON CIAA FOOTBALL RANKING

Saint Augustine's College is predicted to finish near the top of the CIAA according to the 2009 preseason football poll, which was released July 23 at the CIAA Football Press Conference and Luncheon held in Jones Dining Hall on the campus of Virginia State University. With 52 lettermen returning, including 16 starters, the Falcons are picked to finish fourth in the conference and third in the CIAA's Western Division.

TWO FALCONS MAKE PRESEASON ALL-CIAA TEAM

The Falcons will be led by defensive stalwarts Phillip Stevenson (Statesville, N.C.) and Marcus Crump (Pittsboro, N.C.), who were selected to the 2009 Pre-season All-CIAA football team, which was also announced July 23.

D2FOOTBALL.COM RECOGNIZES SANDERS

Running back Walter Sanders (Jr./Baltimore, Md.) is listed in the CIAA Others To Watch category by D2football.com. Sanders was named to the 2008 All-CIAA second team after rushing for 840 yards, which was second highest in the CIAA.

MCNEILL ADDED TO FALCON FOOTBALL STAFF

Former Johnson C. Smith head coach Daryl McNeill joined the Falcon football coaching staff as running backs coach this summer.

SEXTON EXPECTED TO START AGAINST FALCONS

Quarterback Cam Sexton is listed as the starting quarterback on the Catawba depth chart. Sexton transferred from the University of North Carolina, where he started eight games last season. He has one year of eligibility remaining.

CATAWBA AMONG NCAA SCORING STREAK LEADERS

Catawba has scored in 167 straight games which is the sixth-longest streak among Division II teams. Valdosta State has the longest current streak without being shutout. Valdosta State has scored in 214 consecutive games.
